PUBLIC CONTRACTS REVIEW BOARD

Case 1198 – MT/54/2017 - Tender for Professional Services including Stakeholders Consultations, Launching and Monitoring the Implementation of a Pilot Model Structure within the Hotel Industry for a Green Mobility Hotel Award and Labelling Scheme as Part of the Destinations Project, Civitas, Horizon 2020

Remedies before the Closing Date of a Call for Competition

The publication date of the call for tenders was the 15^{th} June 2018 whilst the closing date of the call for tenders was the 16^{th} July 2018. The estimated value of the tender (exclusive of VAT) was $\in 85,000$.

On the 12th July 2018, PKF Malta filed a Call for Remedies before the Closing Date of the Competition against Transport Malta.

On 7th August 2018 the Public Contracts Review Board composed of Dr Anthony Cassar as Chairman, Mr Carmelo Esposito and Mr Lawrence Ancilleri as members convened a public hearing to discuss the objections.

The Chairman of the Public Contracts Review Board, Dr Anthony Cassar, welcomed the parties and invited submissions.

Ms Danielle Hermanson, Representative of PKF Malta, said that the reason for seeking this pre-

contractual remedy was that PKF Malta had sought clarification on certain points, replies for which were not issued in time to enable them to submit their bid. They also sought clarification

regarding the requirement in the tender that bidders had to be registered with the MFSA. The

Contracting Authority had now agreed to extend the time for submission of bids.

Dr Katrina Borg Cardona, Legal Representative of the Ministry for Tourism confirmed that the

Contracting Authority had already started the procedure to extend the closing date for

submission of tenders.

The Chairman thanked both parties for their submission and declared the hearing closed.

This Board,

Having noted this Call for Remedies filed by PKF Malta, (hereinafter referred

to as the Appellants), prior to the Closing Date for Competition on 12 July

2018 refers to the contentions made by the latter with regards to the Tender of

Reference MT/54/2017 issued by the Ministry for Tourism listed as Case No

1198 in the records of the Public Contracts Review Board.

Whereby, the Appellants contend that:

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a) Their main contention is that they had sought clarification on certain points mentioned in the Tender Dossier, however, no reply was forthcoming up to the closing date of the Tender and in this regard, PKF Malta maintains that the period for submission of bids should be extended.

This Board has also noted the Contracting Authority's "Reasoned Letter of Reply" dated 13 July 2018 and also its verbal submissions during the Public Hearing held on 7 August 2018, in that:

a) The Ministry for Tourism recognises and accepts the Appellants' concern and had already commenced procedures for the extension of the closing date for submissions.

This Board, after having heard submissions made by the parties concerned, notes that the Contracting Authority will extend the period for the submission of offers, so that any clarifications requested by the prospective Bidders will be appropriately addressed. At the same instances, it was also acknowledged that PKF Malta's concerns will be taken into consideration by the Contracting Authority.

In view of the above, this Board:

i) Upholds the concerns made by PKF Malta;

ii) Orders the Ministry for Tourism to extend the period for the closing

date for submission of offers;

iii) Instructs the Contracting Authority to take into consideration the

Appellants' concerns and at the same instance ensures that the

conditions laid out in the Tender Dossier will not, in any way

whatsoever, impede or create obstacles for Bidders to participate;

iv) Instructs the Contracting Authority to effect any

amendments/alterations to the present conditions by way of

clarifications.
